## PONDERINGS JUNE 2020

"The new normal" is everywhere these days. I was in a local business yesterday and the proprietor shared with me his fear

that he might be required to conduct business in perpetuity from behind a plexiglass shield. He promised to resist this in some way if it were to become a requirement. He also shared his weariness with the vocabulary shift caused by the pandemic—the catchphrases and clichés that have embedded themselves in our daily conversations. I was inclined to agree, and like him, I share his desire for things to get back to "normal".

But what is normal anyway? What do we hope will be in effect for our schools come September? We are immersed in thoughts of distancing, rotating schedules, sanitizer, facemasks and more. I think it is time to mentally shift away from our obsession with the virus and return to our larger vision of what school is and ought to be. This school has always sought to embed its daily practice in the context of a larger vision rooted in Scripture. It has always been an anomaly. It exists to challenge the status quo. I am reminded through my involvement on the AISCA Board that the landscape of education in Alberta is vibrant, dynamic and exciting. Independent schools, though representative of a relatively small percentage of Alberta schools, are growing at twice the rate of fully funded public schools. This trend speaks to a desire for change in our existing institutions that is being expressed by an evergrowing number of parents who are willing to commit significant time and resources to their children

It would seem that the change in the air in education is one our supporting community was on to long ago. I believe that a proactive, energetic approach to schooling is rooted in a Reformed approach to life as a whole. Jesus demands everything of us — we must surrender everything to Him. When we return to normal, we will once again face the challenges of running a school founded on incarnate Truth. The challenges will continue in this deeply countercultural endeavour, but we know that He will prevail. The blessings He promises if we remain faithful will always sustain us. That is the eternal "normal" we can count on.


