

#### **Opening Message**

We have been blessed at CACHS with a great start to another school year. At times I get caught up in the frustrations of COVID, but more often than not I am energized by the sounds of students in our halls, classes being taught, clubs meeting at lunch, and the athletics teams gathering before and after school. The past year and a half has been challenging, and for students not being together has probably been the most challenging. So much of the learning and growth that high school students miss out on is not quantifiable or even possible when learning goes online and schools are limited to the "course work". 
