A LETTER FROM OPEN PARACHUTE

Dear Parents,

We are pleased to announce that this year we will be delivering the Open Parachute Mental Health Program to our students. This program addresses issues of stigma surrounding mental health in young people, encourages help-seeking, and creates a culture of mutual support and respect for any struggles that students may face. Students will be participating in small group studies of the Open Parachute program led by teachers on alternating Fridays for approximately 30 minute sessions.

This program was developed by Dr Hayley Watson, an adolescent clinical psychologist who has been developing programs globally for the past 15 years.

There are audio and video-based resources to provide you, as a parent, with practical tools for supporting the well-being of your child at all stages of their life. Parent resources can be found here. (Please email the school for a link if you are reading the in print).

Here is a message from the founder of Open Parachute, Dr Watson:

I am so pleased that your child is taking part in this program. I developed this resource because I want every child to learn practical mental health skills, so they can live life to their fullest potential.

This program aims to build a strong foundation of resilience so that your child can learn to trust in their own abilities, relate to their own feelings in a healthy way, and change any unhelpful patterns that may hold them back at any point in their lives.

It is normal for your children to have feelings stirred up throughout the course of this program, because we are intentionally providing a space where they can address challenging issues in a safe, nurturing, and supportive environment. These conversations can also continue at home if you and your child would like to explore these topics further – the video-based resources for parents can help guide these discussions. We look forward to working with you to support the wellbeing of your child!



The Strategic Plan 2025 was created in June 2022 by the Board and ad hoc Strategic Plan Committee after being challenged to prepare for the future. Guidance in creating Strategic Plan 2025 was given by the Prairie Centre for Christian Education. CACHS stakeholder input was gathered through online surveys, in-person focus groups, committee and Board meetings. Stakeholders included parents, alumni, students, grandparents, CACHS committees, CACHS staff and Society. Through the data collection and consolidation process the following three focuses were identified:

- 1. Educational Program
- 2. Community Relations
- 3. Growth and Infrastructure

For each of the above focuses, Strategic Plan 2025 articulates targets and actions while keeping the CACHS Mission and Vision Statements at the forefront. Strategic Plan 2025 is to guide the Board, administrative team, staff, and committees towards goals and specific actions enabling success in each of the three focuses by the end of the 2024-25 school year.

Focus 1: Educational Program

Context: The core of the CACHS educational program is faith formation within a high school context. As a Christian school, we are called to share our Christian faith with our staff and students by meeting each other on our faith journey and inviting them into a closer relationship with Christ. Wellness at CACHS is then two-fold in that first we pursue relationships within the sacred community of Jesus, and second we create opportunities for students to explore and refine their God-given talents through the Alberta high school curriculum and other learning experiences. Quality teaching and learning promotes the development of innovation and creativity while attending to meaningful assessment and reporting practices. As Strategic Plan 2025 was created, stakeholders consistently reaffirmed the CACHS Vision and Mission statements by reiterating the importance of faith formation and quality teaching and learning as key to education at CACHS.

Outcomes:

- 1. Create student learning environments and practices informed by Christian faith and offered through quality teaching, extracurricular activities, and service opportunities.
- 2. Provide students, staff and community with a faith permeated environment that is safe, caring and enhances faith formation of all students, staff and volunteers.
