PRINCIPAL'S PONDERINGS - CACHS DIPLOMAS

At our last Board meeting we passed the new CACHS Diploma Policy that was drafted by our Education Committee, and will be rolled out in phases over the next few graduating classes. The CACHS Diploma was first created during the early years of CACHS, but it never held students to specific requirements. With this new CACHS Diploma Policy, we have formalized historical expectations and completed one of our Strategic Plan 2025 goals.

During our strategic planning process last spring, stakeholders gave input on a number of items now included in our CACHS Diploma. Our school has expanded our learning supports for all students including those with special needs, and so the CACHS Diploma accepts students in all three graduation streams: Alberta Certificate of High School Achievement, Alberta High School Diploma, and Certificate of School Completion. High school students are not required to take full schedules each semester to achieve these government awards, but at CACHS we encourage students to expand their interests and knowledge by limiting student spares. Moreover, we will continue requiring students to take two religious studies courses – Old Testament Studies, New Testament Studies and/or World Religions.

Loudly and clearly, survey and focus group respondents expressed their desire for CACHS students to serve their community both inside and outside of school. Moving to include 30 volunteer hours as a CACHS Diploma requirement appropriately expresses active citizenship, and the amount chosen aligned with the Ontario Secondary School Diploma requirement of 10 hours per high school year.

As our students move into the Spring of their Grade 12 year they will now be required to apply to graduate, and as a result take ownership of their time at CACHS. Students will have to prove that they have fulfilled their Alberta graduation requirements and the CACHS Diploma requirements. As part of their application to graduate, students will reflect on their time at CACHS and give parents and staff feedback on how CACHS has shaped them and prepared them for life beyond high school.

We hope that the CACHS Diploma comes to represent the distinctiveness of our graduates' high school education, and that as a result our school community can celebrate the Lord's faithfulness to our students through their secondary education.

CACHS Diploma

Graduation is the culmination/completion of the grade school experience for CACHS students and their parents, and as such it is a significant milestone in their lives. Graduating from CACHS is a unique high school achievement requiring courses and participation above and beyond the provincial requirements, thus CACHS graduates are to be rewarded with a separate CACHS Diploma. Coming together at the CACHS graduation day is an event that, for the students, parents, and supporting community, serves as a reflection of God's covenantal faithfulness and the grateful response of His people in the area of education. Consequently, the CACHS Diploma serves as an appropriate expression of that significance.

CACHS Diploma Requirements

To receive a CACHS Diploma students must:

- 1. Achieve either an Alberta High School Diploma or Alberta Certificate of High School Achievement or Certificate of School Completion.
- 2. Have taken no spares in Grade 10, no more than one spare in Grade 11, and no more than two spares in Grade 12.
- 3. Attend CACHS for a minimum of one school year.
- 4. Complete two religious studies courses offered by CACHS.
- 5. Complete a minimum of 30 volunteer hours. Signed off on by an appropriate overseer.
- 6. Apply to graduate by April 1st of their grade 12 year.

All requirements for the CACHS Diploma are enforced and voided at the discretion of the CACHS administration team.




