PRINCIPAL'S PONDERINGS - SCIENCE 24

We may have a new favourite class at CACHS, and it may not be one we expected. Previously some students have approached Science 24 as their "last required science course that puts an end to the 11 years of science torture by Alberta Education". In the past we have run Science 24 in the same classroom as other science courses like Science 20 and Biology 20. Rationale for running parallel courses were pragmatic, such as low student numbers, lack of teacher availability, and the idea that having diverse academic groupings of students would have "a rising tide lifts all boats" effect. We took a bit of a leap this semester by offering Science 24 in its own classroom with its own teacher.

Through the strategic planning process last year, our staff were encouraged to connect classrooms to the community – much more doable in some courses than others. In Science 24 this semester Mrs de Boon has lined up an itinerary of field trips appreciating science happening at a dairy farm (comparing milking technologies, breeding), Gull Lake Honey Co. (food science), Blindman Brewery (chemical reactions), mechanic (energy conversion), Doef's Greenhouse (food genetics, greenhouse environment control), Good Neighbour Coffee (roasting beans), and a Cranna Lake field study. Mrs. de Boon's Science 24 class has become a bit of a hot commodity because she has taken the course to the community and helped students appreciate science happening all around them.

Offering students meaningful lessons through diverse programs such as Science 24 fulfills our mission at CACHS – Transformative Education within a Christian Community. It takes a welcoming community who understand their workplaces as kingdom work to allow a course like Science 24 to really shine. At CACHS we now see Science 24 as a tide encouraging other courses to raise their community connections. Well done Mrs. de Boon and her Science 24 students!




