PRINCIPAL'S PONDERINGS

LIKE MANY READERS OF CHRISTIAN LITERATURE,

my joy of stories was spurred on by my elementary school encounter with C.S. Lewis' The Chronicles of Narnia. I remember sharing these classic stories with my classmates, younger sisters and Mom as we read the books and discussed the characters. I remember being challenged by Lucy's compassion and Edmund's loyalty, and aligning with Peter's leadership and Susan's analytical mind. This past year I started reading Lewis' series with my boys, and they have also enjoyed getting lost in the lands of Calormen, Narnia, Archenland, and the others. What a blessing it is sharing in these great works that reveal their wisdom again regardless of the reader's age.



As part of our professional development at CACHS, each year our staff reads a book that kick-starts our staff meeting discussions. For the most part, these books are chosen to cultivate our Reformed Christian worldview and guide staff in our educational and societal

context. Our current book – Surviving Religion 101 by Micheal J. Kruger – is organized as a set of letters written by a Christian father to his Christian daughter leaving for her post-secondary studies at a large public university.

In chapter 9 of his book, Kruger offers a number of convincing arguments to believe in miracles regardless of having witnessed miracles. He then closes chapter 9 with Jesus' challenge to his disciples that unless they become like children, they won't enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:3).

Kruger's closing argument for miracles includes the endearing alignment of Jesus' requirement for child-like wonder allowing the possibility of miracles, and Lucy's openness to receive the magic of Narnia by exploring and sharing the forest beyond the wardrobe.

These two literary experiences bring to my mind the equally important developmental traits of curiosity and wonder. Curiosity strives to find answers, and wonder gives the opportunity to sit and reflect in the unknown without the need for finality or closure. When you have both of these traits playing together it allows for understanding, but also space for the miraculous and inexplicable. Today in our world of technological advancements, some may speculate if we can still allow for wonder. Can the Bible really be trusted as the inspired, infallible and authoritative Word of God? Is there still space to believe that a first century Jewish rabbi was killed by brutally effective Roman soldiers and then resurrected three days later? Could it be true that Jonah actually survived three days in a fish? At CACHS we can confidently say yes to these questions as we explore our place in God's great story of love for His Creation.

During the second semester our teachers and students will intentionally utilise ChatGTP, so that together we can discover the helpfulness and limitations of artificial intelligence (AI). What does it look like to teach and learn with ChatGPT and Siri at our beck and call? How can these devices and technologies aid in keeping both curiosity and wonder alive? As a powerful technology that naturally encourages curiosity, it is our aim that AI will be another tool helping us explore the wonder of Creation.



- What is your full name? Thomas Nolan
- What year did you graduate from CACHS? 2019
- How many years did you attend CACHS? All 3 years
- What is a core memory you have about CACHS? Rushing to play ping pong on breaks in grade 10, sports performance hikes with Mr. Eggink, and dominating the high school soccer league with a bunch of farm kids.
- What is your biggest takeaway in values, beliefs and morals from CACHS that you feel has guided you or been a foundation piece in your life after high school? Seek those who are extremely proficient at what they aim for in life and allow them to mentor you while you're young. Learn to accept that life out of high school can be tough and you need to have a "Whatever it takes" mentally to achieve your life's pursuits and be successful even though it can be uncomfortable for periods of time. Accept the help of others who have your best interest at heart, but don't be afraid to take risks and go at things alone. You do that and pretty soon you may find yourself winning!
- If you had to go back and do your high school experience all over again, what would you change and why? I would have played more high school sports like volleyball and potentially basketball.
- Where did you go after high school and where do you live now? I lived local to Lacombe for the first 2 years after high school, then spent 6-½ months in the Yukon near Dawson City, but came back to Lacombe after that.
- What career path did you take and where are you working right now? I started the RAP program in High School for Heavy Duty Technician and continued that after high school. I worked within my family's business in town at Hopkins Construction fixing Loaders, Dozers, Rock trucks, Skid steers, Excavators, Graders, Water pumps, Generators, Gravel/Heavy Haul trucks and Trailers, Tractors and Gravel crushers. From there I went and ran a mobile service truck for a family placer mine in the Yukon by myself as a second year apprentice as their main mechanic on 2 locations(one near Dawson City up on a hill, and one on Sulphur Creek). We worked 7 days a week, 14.5hours a day for 6-½ months straight fixing, welding, and operating equipment as big as Komatsu 375 dozers and Hitachi/John Deere 850 excavators!

- What career path did you take and where are you working right now? (Continued) Once the gold mining season ended I came back and worked for the family business again to finish off the year. I was offered to start my own company running a service truck in the Yukon and at home local to Lacombe, so once I finished my 3rd year of schooling I purchased my own service truck and rigged it up to start out on my own. I incorporated the company and called it Nolan HD Enterprises Ltd. I worked for myself for the first year, went back to school and got my 4th year finished up, then got back at it again. I stay local to Lacombe and serve mainly industries such as Aggregate, Oil Field Trucking, and some Agriculture. I am currently 22 years old and 2024 will be my 3rd year in business for myself!
- What is the best part about your job or the work you are doing? It is a good mix between mental and physical work. It can be hard work and is rewarding once one is successful troubleshooting an issue and taking the necessary steps to repair it properly for each customer. I take great pride in my work and it has allowed me to continue turning my ambitions into reality. It is like being a medical doctor but for machines, but it is all man-made and therefore, there's always a fix!
- If you could give advice to your high school self, what would it be? Don't get stressed out about minor details that don't really affect the fountain of your life and spend as much time with friends as possible! Learn to Improve, Adapt, and Overcome in any situation!

A reminder to parents and guardians of CACHS students to complete the 2024 Alberta Education Assurance Surveys that are mailed out at the beginning of February. The deadline for these surveys to be completed is March 1st. The Assurance Surveys provide CACHS and Alberta Education with valuable feedback regarding the quality of education your child receives. Data from these surveys informs our Annual Education Results Report as well as our Education Plans made for future CACHS improvement.

Parents receive information to access the online survey in English or French directly from Alberta Education via Canada Post. Parents requiring a survey in a language other than English or French are instructed to contact their school principal. Punjabi, Cree, Korean, Denesuţine, Tagalog, Chinese (Traditional or Simplified), Arabic, Spanish or Urdu translations are currently available.

Parents requiring a replacement RAC: are to contact System Assurance Branch directly at EDC.SystemAssurance@gov.ab.ca or (780) 643-9193 (dial 310-0000 for toll-free access). Parents are to provide the name of the school, school authority (or principal name) and grade of the student. No personal information about the student (name, age, or ASN) is required.




