## Principal's Ponderings

The 2024-25 school year marks the 35th school year that CACHS has been in existence. Some other fun facts about this year is that we have 130 students, of which 59 are in their first year at our school. Furthermore, among our staff we have 5 new teachers. So the vets at CACHS are only slightly in the majority!

Our vision at CACHS remains "Striving for Excellence through Christ", and our mission remains "Transformative Education within a Christian Community". These are lofty statements that can be difficult to assess our level of success in achieving them. To strive is to labour towards a goal with great effort, and so we should ask the question of ourselves, are we willing to give our best effort to our education? Teachers and students to class discussions? Teachers in their lesson preparation? Students studying for tests? All of us in our personal hygiene? Teacher feedback when grading? Friendships? Clubs? Athletics? These are tall tasks that we have accepted when we entered our school. But where to begin as teachers? As students? Support staff?

The theme at our school wide Retreat was "Intentional Community". To me the idea of intentional community rests on a group of individuals willingly pursuing "agape love," or in english "sacrificial love." The idea of sacrificial or selfless love is counter cultural and maybe even at odds with our fallen human nature.

Society tells us that we need to love ourselves first and celebrate everything about ourselves all the time. Take a selfie, post the highlights, edit our lives into public idols of self worship. We are trained to only find self worth when we receive 'likes' and comments. Jesus explains love as something quite different; so different that society might even call it peculiar.

In Luke chapter 10, Jesus said that the second greatest commandment is to "love our neighbour as ourselves." We know that Jesus then used the story of the Good Samaritan to explain what he meant by neighbour. In no uncertain terms Jesus declares that we are to love those that society and even our closest social circles would tell us is okay to hate, pick on, make fun of or bully.

It is good for each of us to wonder who our neighbours are. Who might Jesus use to get our attention regarding who our neighbour is? Would it be the student standing on their own in the hallway? The one with the shiny car but no one wants to go with for a ride? The person who everyone wants to use to get a good grade on a partner project, but outside of class no one wants to spend time with? The person who dresses differently? The one that didn't make the sports team? Maybe those that aren't on sports teams? And further, who in the student body and staff are we hesitant to extend the care that every neighbour deserves? Chances are, the person that comes to mind is probably someone that the Lord is using to trial our faith in Him.

When we think about Transformative Education within a Christian Community, we are not thinking about creating a community that looks like every other school. We don't aim to have cliques and stratified groups where some belong and others don't. A Christian community shouldn't be dominated by peer pressure, bullying, jokes at the expense of others, circles of friends that don't make space for others, and the like.

How do we evaluate if we have achieved our vision and mission statements? Our theme of intentional community? We might start by considering where we see the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5). So what does that look like?

- We are people that pick up garbage that is left in the hallway.
- We say good morning to each other as we enter the school and classroom.
- We seek every educational opportunity to find our place in God's story of love for His Creation.
- At the start of each school day our staff prays together for our students, staff and other schools.
- Our families sacrifice financially to commit to a Christ-centered school.
- We bear each other's burdens and joys through classroom devotions and prayer.
- We eat meals together and thank the Lord for them.
- We celebrate character development through our Student of the Month program.
- We are equally proud of our athletic sportsmanship as we are of our championships.
- We sing together.

We are not perfect, but through Christ we will continue to strive for His Excellence. This year I have asked students to stretch themselves and allow a little sanctification to take place. I asked them the following questions at our opening assembly:

- Will you be happy for others when they succeed and you don't?
- Will you care for someone when you don't want to?
- Will you decide to not pass along a vengeful or inappropriate message, text or photo when you know it would make your friends laugh while also really hurting someone else.
- Are you willing to give up a short laugh with your friends to protect the dignity and worth of others in our school community?
- Will you help someone in class who is struggling with a concept?
- Will you ask someone how their day has been after you have had great success in sports, academics, or other achievement?
- Will you seek peace between classmates when feelings have been hurt?
- Will you encourage a teammate when they need extra reps, or will you just see it as an opportunity for you to get more playing time while they struggle?

As I close, I ask that each of us – students, parents, staff, supporters, etc – reflect on our willingness to take on personal responsibility for building our 2024-25 Christian community at CACHS. I ask that we don't seek excuses for when things go wrong, but instead that we own and correct our mistakes, self-reflect and ask ourselves what we could have done differently or still can do to make it right.

Perhaps we should ask ourselves the same question the expert in the law asked Jesus so many years ago... who is my neighbour? And then follow the lesson on neighbourliness that the expert in the law received from the Parable of the Good Samaritan. The expert in the law came to realise that the neighbour to the injured man was "the one who had mercy on him". Maybe then with open hearts each of us follow Jesus' direction for all of us to "Go and do likewise" (Luke 10).
